Welcome to the Corona Virus Delta Variant Reunion update edition (Revised).

I would like to start by sending apologies as we are just now getting this out. This has been a very difficult year. With all our venues not opening due to the CV-19, the Board has been meeting regularly to track the progression of the virus and trying to decide about how and if to move forward with our scheduled reunion in Colorado Springs.

This has been a very difficult decision to make but we (the board) feel the decision to postpone our schedule October 10-14, 2021, reunion is the best decision for all our members considering the virus is still potent and has reinvented itself. If you have already made your hotel reservations, you will

NOT need to do anything as all the current reservations have been transferred to our new dates. Most of the airlines have been working with folks during this time to cancel or reschedule flights with refunds and/or credits.

Jim McCabe has lined up several speakers for us during the reunion as well as for the banquet.


DON'T FORGET THAT THE THEME WILL BE THE WILD WILD WEST!!!! BRING YOUR COWBOY HAT!!!

Historian's Corner August 18, 2021

Some of you may wonder just how vibrant is an association whose living veterans range from 96 to 103 years old? Well, I'm pleased to report that we couldn't be doing much better, and it is all because of you! As we have suffered through this pandemic for the past 17 months, many were unemployed, under-employed or working from home. Over fifty of our current members took this opportunity to find us and join our 307th BG Assoc. I am not talking about membership renewals.



These are new members who like

the rest of us paid dues, purchased books, patches, hats, etc. and contributed to our GoFundMe to help raise the funds needed to reprint The Long Rangers A Diary of the 307th Bombardment Group (H), by Sam Britt. It was the least they could do as it was all these new members that completely depleted our supply of this book in the first place! Reunions, many memberships have lapsed as most of us utilized the reunion registration forms to renew our annual memberships. Related to our association's long history of encouraging the involvement of family and friends in addition to 307th BG veteran membership, we have not only endured, we have grown. Of the hundreds of WWII units, there are only 4 remaining Army Air Corps organizations still having reunions. Thanks to all of you, we comprise the largest membership of any WWII bombardment or fighter group association in the USA!

In recent years, we nurtured and cemented a bond with the 307th Bomb Wing at Barksdale Air Force Base in Louisiana where they fly B-52 Bombers as part of Global Strike Command. Since we 1st became acquainted with one another they have supported us every step of the way-attending our 307th Bomb Group reunions, hosting us at 307th Bomb Wing reunions, and flying a B-52 Bomber to our San Diego reunion in 2019. They had planned to fly a B-52 Bomber to Colorado Springs for our postponed reunion this October and I'm sure, if possible, they will do their very best to fly one to our rescheduled reunion June 8-12, 2022. After supplying the necessary documentation, it was the 307th Bomb Wing Public Affairs Office who secured the revision to the 307th Bombardment Group's Lineage and Honors History to include the October 26, 1944, strike on the Japanese Naval Fleet. A 307th BG Assoc. member, Michael Protiva, provided possibly the ultimate record of the success of the 307th BG strike on the IJN (Imperial Japanese Navy) Fleet, 441026 - the records of the CinCPac (Commander in Chief Pacific) Admiral Chester W. Nimitz himself.

Just a few years ago, another member, Paul Halagan, provided us the only original copy of the 307th BG's Distinguished Unit Citation for the October 3, 1944, strike on the Japanese oil installations at Balikpapan, Borneo.

When I became 307th BG Assoc. Historian just over a decade ago I was getting way too many inquiries regarding lost airmen for whom I had no information. This was unacceptable to me. I worked closely with Dan Odenweller who has since passed and others who had compiled the original data and have expanded our listings. In recent weeks this project has now grown from about 50 to over 300 serialed bombers, and from 200 307th BG airmen KIA to 808 airmen KIA. We have added the numbers for all our MACR's (Missing Air Crew Reports) and these reports are available to our members. Of course, there is a corresponding increase in known survivors and B-24 Bomber nose art also listed in the History links on our website, www.307bg.net

If you desire any historical information regarding a 307th Bombardment Group veteran, please contact me through our website or my email address below. I can provide you any available Combat Mission Reports, Crew Loading Lists, Letters of Commendation, Distinguished Unit Citations, Photos, Combat Videos, etc. I should add that you should not assume your beloved 307th BG veteran fully informed you of their service. This can range from having told you nothing

to possibly misinforming you so you would not inquire about their deployment in WWII. In this, they protected themselves and you from the horrors they experienced.

More recently, we have been contacted by the 370th FLTS (Flight Test Squadron) at Edwards Air Force Base as they learned their roots go back to our 307th Bombardment Group's 370th Bombardment Squadron. Like the 307th Bomb Wing at Barksdale AFB, the 370th FLTS was planning to attend and speak at our rescheduled October 2021 reunion. I'm sure they will make every effort to join us in Colorado Springs June 8-12, 2022.




