- Target Falau (Mission incomplete) September 3, 1944. Lost No. 3 engine Turned back 40 minutes from target. Time - 6:50.
- Target Halmaheras-Lolobato A/D. September 10, 1944. Weather Fair. Mission uneventful. Time 9:30. No. 2
- Target Halmahera-Miti A/D. September 13, 1944. Weather Bad; Hit a front (thunderhead). Indicated sirspeed OMPH-400MPH-0. Cables and control surface damaged; flight indicator out. Went around front on way back. Time - 10:05.
- Target Ceram-Supply Area. September 16, 1944. Weather Fair. Cloudy over target. Made three runs No. on target to find it in clouds. Time - 9:20.
- Target Balikpapen, Borneo (Refinery). October 10, 1944. Weather Fair. Fighter cover P-47, P-36. Intercepted by about 25-32 Jap fighters. Ack-Ack & Phos. Time - 15:45.
- Target Balikpapen, Borneo (Wax Works). October 14, 1944. Weather Good. Fighter cover over targets P-47 & P-30. Intercepted about 5-0 passes at us. Landed at Middlesburg Is., and came home October 15. Time - 14:30, 2:05 - 10:35.
- Target Shipping off Northwest coast of Borneo. October 25, 1944. Weather - Fair. Found three ships-

two Sugar Dog vessels and one Barge. Sank one Sugar Dog. Only opposition, one 7.7 machine gun. Bassed up at Morotai on'way back. Time - 14:45, 3:10 - 17:55.

- No. 8 Farget Nip Task Force (Search) Mindanao Sea. November 2, 1944. Weather Good. Did not find Task Force. Salveed bombs on way home. Gassed up at Morotai on way back. Time 11:00, +2:55, =1355.
- No. 9 Target Carolina A/D, Negros Is. November 6, 1944.
 Weather Good up to target. Target was 9/10 covered
 by clouds. Results were unobserved. Fighter cover 8 P-47. Interception 6-8 Hamps. Four enemy planes
 shot down by P-47. Gassed up at Morotai on way back.
 Time 15:15.
- No. 10- Target Damaguente A/D, Negros Is. November 11, 1944.
 Weather Fair. (Secondary target) Primary target was
 covered by clouds. Fighter cover 22 planes P-38 &
 F-47. No interception. Gassed up at Morotai on way
 back. Time 13:50.
- No. 11- Target Shipping-Celebes. November 14, 1944.

 Weather Good. Circled Celebes. Found no enemy shipping. Bombed docks at Manado town on Celebes (Secondary target). Left tire blew out on landing at Morotai. Stayed there overnight. Time 12:15, 3:30, 15:45.
- No. 12- Target Alicante A/D, Negros Is. November 24, 1944. Weather Good. Fighter escort about 10-15. Interception 5-6 Hamps & Zekes. Escorts shot down two. No passes at formation. Fime 9:50.
- No. 13- Target La Carlota A/D, Negros Is. November 26, 1944. Weather Good. No interception. Left wheel brake locked on landing; thought nose wheel had collapsed. Everyone raced for tail. No damage to plane or crew. Time 9:40.
- No. 14- Target Puerto Princesa A/D, Palawan Is. November 29, 1944. Weather Good. No interception. Fighter cover P-38; sky was full of them. Time 11:10.
- No. 15- Target Bacolod A/D, Negros Is. December 1, 1944.
 Weather Not so good. Left squadron formation just
 after we left target. The rest got interception by
 three enemy planes. Fighter stayed with us (P-47).
 Hit small front just after we left target. Time 10:30.
- No. 16- Target Malimpoeng A/D, Celebes. December 3, 1944.
 Weather Good, but cloudy. No interception. Fighter escort failed to show up. Target was clear (no clouds

covered target). Went back to Noemfor. They were expecting an attack on Morotai, either Jap suicide squads or Jap Commandos. Fime - 11:10.

- No. 17- Target Galela A/D, Halmaheras Is. December 5, 1944. Weather Good. Sombs fell short of runway. Flak Heavy but was above, below, and a little behind us. No damage to plane. First time I could see our base from any target. Time 4:35.
- No. 18- Target Recco-Mission (Sulu Sea). December 7, 1944.
 Weather Fair. Search for part of Jap Fleet One
 Cruiser, two Destroyers. Went up around Tawi-Tawi,
 Is., in the Philippines. Did not find them. Time 7:30.
- No. 19- Target Manduiriano A/D, Panay Is. December 11, 1944. Weather Very good. Fighter cover, P-47. Saw seven of them, but did not get full count. Bomb pattern was very good. Time 9:50.
- No. 20- Target Carolina A/D, Negros Is. December 13, 1944. Weather Good. Made second run on target before dropping bombs. Swell bomb pattern. No interception. No Ack-ack. Time 10:10.
- No. 21- Target Batanges A/D, Luzon Is. January 13, 1945. Weather Good. Primary target covered with clouds. Hit tertiary target. No interception. No Ack-Ack. Time 12:15.
- No. 22- Target Jesselton A/D, Borneo. January 15, 1945.
 Weather Fair. Bomb pattern and hits were very good.
 Fighter escorts, P-38, did not show up. No interception.
 No Ack-Ack. Time 11:10.
- No. 23- Target Miti Supply Area, Borokoe Is. January 18, 1945. Weather Good. No interception nor Ack-Ack. Time 1:20.
- No. 24- Target Oil Storage Tanks, Canacao Point, peninsula off Luzon Is. January 28, 1945. Weather Fair. Ack-Ack over Corrigedor. I guess the Jape thought we were after their large naval guns. About ten to twenty bursts of Ack-Ack with phosphorous bombs. The squadron leader told the pilot to leave the formation, so we circled Ack-Ack. The rest of the formation (five) went over Corrigedor to drop their bombs. No âamage done to formation. No interception. Time 12:35.
- No. 25- Target Cavite, Luzon Is. (Primary), Corrigedor (Secondary), Luzon Is. There was also a tertiary target which was also on Luzon. All three of them were socked in with clouds so we couldn't bomb them. We

went after our fourth target which was on Negros Is. We ran into a front just before we got to Negros Is., and lost the formation. We had to salvo the bombs. Didn't find the fourth target because of the front. There was no interception nor Ack-Ack. January 30, 1945. Time - 12:25.

- No. 26- Target Canacao Peninsula, Radio Station, Luzon Is. February 1, 1945. Weather Darn good. Target was wide open. Swell bomb pattern and hits. No interception nor Ack-Ack. Time 12:05.
- No. 27- Target Canacao Peninsula. February 3, 1945.
 Weather Good. Target was wide open, bombs landed in water though. No interception nor Ack-Ack.
 Time 12:00.
- No. 28- Target Corrigedor (Naval Guns). February 11, 1945. Weather Good. We missed the guns about a hundred yards but probably did some damage to them. No interception nor Ack-Ack. Time 12:15.
- No. 29- Target Kendari A/D, Dispersal Area. February 16, 1945. Weather Not so good. Went through three or four fronts. Target was well covered with bombs. Ack-Ack was a little above and below us. No interception. Time 7:45.
- No. 30- Target Jesselton A/D, Borneo. February 20, 1945. Weather Fair on way up pretty bad on way back. Had to make three runs on target. No Ack-Ack nor interception. Time 11:25.
- No. 31- Target Sandakan A/D, Borneo. February 23, 1945.
 Weather Fair on way up pretty bad on way back.
 Made three runs on target because of clouds. Looked
 for downed P-38 pilot on way back. No Ack-Ack nor
 interception. Time 9:40.
- No. 32- Target Tawau A/D, Bormeo. February 25, 1945. Weather Fair. Looked for the downed P-38 pilot again; otherwise mission was uneventful. No Ack-Ack nor interception. Time 9:05.
- No. 33- Target Sandakan A/D, Borneo. February 20, 1945. Weather Fair. Good bomb hits and pattern. Searched for B-24 crew from our squadron, that went down yesterday; aid not find them. No Ack-Ack nor interception. Fime 10:00.
- No. 34- Target Sepinggan A/D, Borneo. March 2, 1945. Weather - Fair. Bomb hits nor pattern were not good. Some of the planes' bombs missed target completely.

We were supposed to have Fighter cover (P-38) but it didn't show up. Ack-Ack was right on us. Cur ship got three holes. Did no damage to crew. This target was right next to one that we hit last year in October. The target was -- Balikpapen; that's where some of the Ack-Ack came from. Saw one fighter drop phosphorous bombs on other three squadrons. I don't think there was any damage done. Time - 10:05.

- No. 35- Target Jolo Supply Area, Jolo Island. March 4, 1945. Weather Fair. (Secondary). Primary was covered with clouds. Dropped bombs (1,000 lb.) from 4,500 feet because of undercast at 6,000 ft. The plane was rocked a little because of the impact caused by dropping them from 4,500 ft. No Ack-Ack nor interception. Time 8:30.
 - No. 36- Target Zamboanga, Personnel and supply area,
 Mindanao. March 7, 1945. Weather Good. Very good
 bomb hits and pattern. Had to make third run over
 target. No Ack-Ack nor interception. Time 7:35.
 - No. 37- Farget Calario A/D, Dispersal Area, Mindanao.
 March 9, 1945. Weather Not so good. When we returned to base it was covered with a front. Saw one B-24 from another squadron blow up over target today; don't know what did it. Some say a bomb from a squadron above them. Nobody got out of the plane. Good bomb hits and pattern. No Ack-Ack nor interception. Time 7:05.
 - No. 38- Target Tarakan, Borneo. March 11, 1945.

 Weather Bad on way to target Fair over target,
 and on way back. Circled three times at Round Avo
 Point, but couldn't find formation there or on way
 back. Made single ship run on target. No Ack-Ack
 nor interception. Time 9:15.
 - No. 39- Target Davao Personnel Area, Mindanao. March 13, 1945.
 Weather Fair. Made second run on target before
 dropping bomos. Bomb hits and pattern were very good.
 Started about four fires. No Ack-Ack nor interception.
 Time 4:40.
 - No. 40- Target Weather Recon. Mission. March 14, 15, 1945. Weather Good. Took off the 14th at 19:30 landed 15th at 07:20. Went to Zamboanga, back to base, back again to Zamboanga, then returned to base. Time 11:40.
 - No. 41- Target Sepinggan A/D, Borneo. March 10, 1945. Weather - Fair. Ack-Ack from Balikpapen again today. Ship was holed only once - no damage. Fighter
